

Linkage of the courses

What are the linkages?

Linkage is, in the simplest way, the assignment of the course that we have enrolled in to the appropriate study programme (i.e. field of study) and to the appropriate stage (i.e. semester or year).

Do you need to link items?

Yes, it is our student duty. Unlinked courses do not count towards our "achievements," they do not count towards the average and are not taken into account for stage checkup.

I study at two programmes (majors). Can I link PE and foreign language classes to two programmes?

Yes, of course.

What about linkage when completing items ahead of time?

In a situation where, for example, in the first year we carry out a course that will be required from us in the second year, we should leave it unlinked and attach it when we are in the second year. The points in one course are indivisible – i.e. if I have to get 3 ECTS points in a general university course for 1 year and enroll in a course for 4 ECTS points – it will not be possible for 3 ECTS points to stay on one year and one point to be transferred to next year. One course can only be attached to one stage (year / semester).



Links and applications

Is it possible to link courses carried out during the exchange (at another university in the country or abroad)?

Yes, it is possible, but it is based on the decision of the Director of Studies or the Head of Teaching Unit.

Is the lack of linkage an argument to refuse to extend the Student ID?

Definitely not – the lack of linkage is not the basis for refusing to extend a student ID for the next semester. The basis for such refusal may only be removal from the list of students.

Is it possible to modify the linkage?

Yes, at the student's request, the Office may modify the linkage.
